My travels and assorted news...

I enjoyed sharing their daily schedule of Mass, meals, and prayer. Their honesty, kindness, and straightforward faith were inspiring. It is common to find at least one Brother in the chapel praying and simply being in the presence of God. All of them are grateful for the healthcare staff and they take advantage of regular opportunities for physical therapy and massages.


